

I was there and this is an accurate and factual record of what happened. It took 30 years for the author to collect, verify and re-verify all these witnesses' statements, for the most part in their own words, and the narrative is written for the non-scientist in a clear and easy-to-read format. It provides a first-hand look at the first modern documented volcanic eruption in the continental United States and is a fascinating read. Remember Harry Truman and Spirit Lake Lodge? He's there, in his own salty words; Governor Dixie Lee Ray's lack of actions before the eruption are analyzed; the local military's reactions to the disaster are discussed; a great deal of the United States' modern disaster response can be seen here in its infancy. Satellite communications came into its own at Mt. St. Helens.

Volcanic eruptions were really unpredictable back in 1980. The sense of impending doom came and went with scientists' declarations, but we on the ground knew something would happen fairly soon. How bad, how far-reaching, how many lives impacted...no one knew. We made our best guesses and did what we thought was prudent. And then we waited. Waitt has recorded this tension and suspense so that reading it I was suddenly back over that table planning the extent of the Red Zone and wondering if it was enough. Or too much.

The author has taken extraordinary pains to ensure that the book is true and accurate, something that's hard to come by these days. Did I really call that National Guard Sergeant "Sonny"? The event was exciting at the time and Richard Waitt has captured that sense in this book. What an accomplishment.
